- To name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the UK in the context of the seaside resorts in the four countries of the UK.



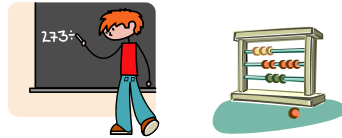
Design and Technology: Hand puppets

- To evaluate a final product against a design plan.



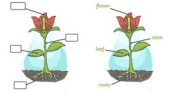
Numeracy

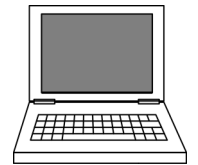
