



# Pupil Premium

## Could you take advantage?

Pupil premium funding gets paid into the school and can be used in a number of different ways to support your child:

- Contribute towards school trips and the Year 6 residential.
- Pay for different items, such as school uniform.
- Contribute to the costs of after school clubs.
- Provide your child with specific resources for use in class.
- The offer of free school meals at lunchtime.

You could be eligible to receive pupil premium if you receive any of the following:

- Income support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit.
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190.)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
- Universal Credit – if you apply on or after 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018, your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get.)
